### What is RSE?

Relationships and sex education (RSE) is learning about the *spiritual, emotional, social* and *physical* aspects of growing up, relationships, sex, human sexuality and sexual health.



It should equip young people with the information, *skills* and *values* to have safe, fulfilling and enjoyable relationships and to take responsibility for their sexual health and well-being.

# Does learning about relationships and sex promote sexual activity?

The research on the quality of RSE points to a more positive outlook: 87 programmes from many countries were examined by UNESCO in 2009. This led to the conclusion that if RSE has an effect it is a positive one:

'sexuality education can lead to later and more responsible sexual behaviour or may have no discernible impact on sexual behaviour.' UNESCO in 2009

# Does learning about relationships and sex promote sexual activity?

Analysis by the NATSAL team over several years consistently shows that men and women who said that lessons at school were their main source of information about sex were more likely to have started having sex at a later age than those for whom parents or other sources, were their main source.

Schools have an important role to play in RSE

To provide young people with the knowledge, understanding and skills they need to manage their relationships and the challenges they may face, now and in the future. It should be carried out as part of the holistic education which seeks to form as well as inform young people in preparation for adult life. ' Catholic Education Service

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Any teaching about love and sexual relationships in a Catholic school must be rooted in the Catholic Church's teaching about what it is to be truly human in Christ, what it means to live well in relationship with others and be presented within a positive framework of Christian virtue. For this reason, we encourage Catholic schools to speak about Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) rather than Sex and Relationship Education (SRE), since this emphasises the importance of healthy relationships to human well being, as the core learning within an RSE curriculum.

RSE and PSHE teach children and young people how to stay safe and healthy, and how to negotiate some of the personal and social challenges they will face growing up and as adults. These subjects form part of the building blocks young people need to thrive in modern Britain. At the moment, too many young people feel they don't have the RSE they need to stay safe and navigate becoming an adult.

It is time to make this change to ensure all children and young people have access to these subjects and to update the current statutory guidance for RSE which was introduced nearly 20 years ago, in 2000. We need high-quality, age-appropriate content that relates to the modern world, addressing issues like cyber bullying, 'sexting' and internet safety.



New Relationships, Sex, Health and Education (RSHE) statutory guidance will be completed by the end of the year, in response to disturbing reports that inappropriate material is being taught in some schools.

The review is needed to make sure all children are protected from inappropriate content in all cases, even if many schools already teach RSHE and engage parents in a positive way.
