Component 2: Externally set Assignment	How to develop a project from a set brief	Develop their response over a preparatory study period This component represents the culmination of learners' Advanced level study and provides a substantial challenge. Learners are required to develop independently a personal response to one of a varied range of stimuli within specified time	A sketchbook and/or loose collection of preparatory work for their area of study
