For Hannah, the most enjoyable aspect was, 'being away from school and having a go at the challenge that was the crate stacking activity.'














REvision Guides to Buy on Parent Pay






Cheshire Schools' Book Award





Do you love to be creative? Are you fantastic at painting? Amazing at sculpture? Why not enter our new art competition? Everyone is welcome to take part.




